The primary goal of Child Welfare Care Coordination is to ensure seamless management of services to meet the needs of children and families; thereby ensuring access to resources and support to enhance positive outcomes.

The following services are provided:

- Assessments
- Case management
- Crisis/emergency support
- Individual Intervention/outpatient and respite assistance
- Medical services (including medication management)
- Recovery support
- Residential services

Child welfare admissions, discharges, and follow up

About the Care Coordinator:

A care coordinator assists in enhancing and expanding services by providing wraparound support to individuals who are referred to Meridian Healthcare from child welfare agencies. The care coordinator coordinates admissions, discharges and follow up with children as well as families; thereby, offering engagement and support in a seamless manner.

Additionally, the care coordinator engages clients in a way that will encourage a continuation of services and recovery.

The care coordinator is responsible for contacting the children, parents/guardians after a referral is received; coordinating admissions to services, managing treatment, as well as developing a plan for follow up (for post discharge).
